By enclosing the content within <CENTER> and </CENTER> tags, the embedded objects such as images can be easily placed in the center of the document.

There are three ways to create list; Bulleted or Unordered List, Numbered or Ordered List and Defination List.

A list of items that are marked with bullets is an unordered list.
The line starts with the <UL> tag and each oitem in the list starts with the <LI> tag.
A list that is marked with numbers is called an orderd list.
Ordered list starts with the <OL> tag and each item in the list starts with the <LI> tag.
Defination list starts with the <DL> tag and each defination starts with the <DD> tag.
To insert an image in your web page we have to specify the <IMG> tag.
To display an image on a page we need to use the SRC attribute.
SRC stands for Source.
