- 65 Full Form of HTML is hyper Text Markup Language.
- 66 HTML documents can be created with any word processor or text editor such as Notepad.
- 67 HTML is a programming language.
- Hyper means that a user can view World Wide Web pages.
- 69 Text is anything written in English language or alphanumeric characters.
- Markup means we can mark up the text we have written as special indicator through special tags.
- 71 HTML is tabbed as a scripting language.
- 72 HTML includes two kinds of text content & markup.
- 73 In HTML the instructions or commands are in the form of text character called tags or markups.
- 74 HTML tags are surrounded by two characters < (less than) and > (greater than).
- 75 < (less than) and > (greater than) signs are called angular brackets.
- 76 HTML tags normally come in pairs like <HTML> and </HTML>.
- 77 The first tag in a pair is the start tag and the second tag is the end tag.
- 78 HTML elements are of two types. They are Container element and Empty element.
- 79 Container element has both the tags i.e., starting tag and the ending tag.
- 80 Container element include both ON tag and OFF tag.
- 81 Empty element has only a starting tag and no ending tag.
- The BASEFONT element is used only once in the whole document.
- The BASEFONT element is used to change the font, size, color or face of a document.
- The major attributes of BASEFONT are SIZE, COLOR and FACE.
- 85 SIZE attribute is used to change the size of the BASEFONT.
- The default value of the attribute is 3 and its valid range is 1 to 7.
- 87 COLOR attribute is used to change the color of the text.
- 88 COLOR can be set by using one of the hexadecimal RRGGBB triple value or color names.
- 89 FACE attribute is used to change the type face or font of the HTML document.
- 90 BR and HR are empty elements.
- 91 BR stands for blank lines.
- HR stands for Horizontal lines.
- The horizontal line has three attributes. They are SIZE, WIDTH and COLOR.
- 94 SIZE increases the size of the line vertically.
- 95 WIDTH increses the width of the line horizontally.

- 96 COLOR changes the color of the line.
- 97 The paragraph tag, inserts a blank line and starts a new paragraph.
- The <P> tag is the HTML tag for inserting a paragraph break at the given place in the text.
- The P element has an ALIGN attribute which takes three values; center, left, right.
- The CENTER element it is used to place the content in the center between the start and the end of the block.
- By enclosing the content within <CENTER> and </CENTER> tags, the embedded objects such as images can be easily placed in the center of the document.
- There are three ways to create list; Bulleted or Unordered List, Numbered or Ordered List and Defination List.
- A list of items that are marked with bullets is an unordered list.
- 104 The line starts with the tag and each oitem in the list starts with the tag.
- 105 A list that is marked with numbers is called an orderd list.
- Ordered list starts with the tag and each item in the list starts with the tag.
- Defination list starts with the <DL> tag and each defination starts with the <DD> tag.
- 108 To insert an image in your web page we have to specify the tag.
- To display an image on a page we need to use the SRC attribute.
- 110 SRC stands for Source.
- An image can be inserted as a background using BACKGROUND attribute of the <body> tag.
- The ALT attribute is used to define an alternate text for an image.
- 113 The value of this attribute an author defined text.
- 114 The tag defines a list item.
- 115 tag is used in both orderd list as well as in unordered list.




