- 97 The paragraph tag, inserts a blank line and starts a new paragraph.
- 98 The <P> tag is the HTML tag for inserting a paragraph break at the given place in the text.
- 99 The P element has an ALIGN attribute which takes three values; center, left, right.
- 100 The CENTER element it is used to place the content in the center between the start and the end of the block.
- 101 By enclosing the content within <CENTER> and </CENTER> tags, the embedded objects such as images can be easily placed in the center of the document.
- 102 There are three ways to create list; Bulleted or Unordered List, Numbered or Ordered List and Definition List.
- 103 A list of items that are marked with bullets is an unordered list.
- 104 The line starts with the <UL> tag and each oitem in the list starts with the <LI> tag.
- 105 A list that is marked with numbers is called an orderd list.
